

TROY SPIKEMEN TOP U.C.L.A. TEAM, 71-60

S.C. Hands Bruins Tenth Straight Loss but Weak Spots Indicate Loss to Bears Saturday

A University of Southern California track squad that is only a shadow of the usual Trojan juggernauts edged out U.C.L.A., 71-60, in their annual meet at the Coliseum yesterday, but in triumph S.C. displayed such glaring weaknesses that it will be a minor miracle if they can get over California next Saturday.

True, S.C. chalked up its 10th straight win over the Westwoods without the services of two certain first-place winners, Shot-putter Ron Thomas and Half-miler Paul Iacono. Thomas has a sprained finger and Iacono has a cold.

Off Form

But the startling facts of the day were that even the supposed topnotchers on the S.C. squad are still a long way from top form, as indicated by the winning times and distances.

Best marks of the afternoon were turned in by Trojans Edsel Curry and Doug Miller, in the broad jump and javelin. Curry hopped 23ft. 8in., while Miller tossed the javelin 188ft. 1in. Both efforts are their best of the season.

Cliff Bourland, who was ailing with an aggravated sinus most of the week, was allowed to enter the 100 and he came through with an eyelash victory over Teammate Jim Jenkins. The time was only 10.1s., however.

Weak Spots

S.C. did even worse than expected in the distances; U.C.L.A. took 25 of the possible 27 digits in the 880, mile and two-mile. Craig Tyler and Mode Perry ran one, two in the half; Densmore and Perry outstepped Trojan Field Berry in the mile and S.C. didn't even have an entry in the two-mile.

Other Trojan soft spots were the high jump and pole vault, in which Harley Tinkham was S.C.'s lone representative. He cleared only 5ft. 11in. in the jump which was good enough for a tie for first, and vaulted but 11ft. 6in.

The mile relay proved the best competitive event, with Anchor-man Bruce Miller making up 10 yards on Bruin Ken Boyd in the stretch to win going away. Had

George Kryder starred for the S.C. freshmen as they rolled to an 82-47 win over the Brubabes. Kryder, who will be eligible to compete against the Bear varsity, won the high hurdles in 15.6s. and high jumped 6ft., both better than the marks set in varsity competition.
